

Crazy Faith...Never Gives Up and Never Gives In.

Heb 10:38-39

38 Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him.

39 But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul.

DRAW BACK= Timidity (The state or quality of lacking in self-assurance, courage or bravery.)

Heb 11:6

6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Jer 9:24

24 But let him that glorieth glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the Lord which exercise lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness, in the earth: for in these things I delight, saith the Lord.

John 16:8-11

8 And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:

9 Of sin, because they believe not on me;

10 Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and ye see me no more;

11 Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged.

2 Thess 2:14

14 Whereunto he called you by our gospel, to the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

2 Sam 5:6-7

6 And the king and his men went to Jerusalem unto the Jebusites, the inhabitants of the land: which spake unto David, saying, Except thou take away the blind and the lame, thou shalt not come in hither: thinking, David cannot come in hither.

7 Nevertheless David took the strong hold of Zion: the same is the city of David.

Ps 24:7

7 Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in.

HEADS - OT:7218

ro'sh (roshe); from an unused root apparently **meaning to shake; the head (as most easily shaken)**, whether literal or figurative (in many applications, of place, time, rank, etc.):

EVERLASTING - OT:5769

OT:5769 <l*ou `owlam (o-lawm'); or `olam (o-lawm'); from OT:5956; properly, **concealed**, i.e. the vanishing point; generally, **time out of mind (past or future)**, i.e. (practically) eternity; frequentatively, adverbial (especially with prepositional prefix) always:

KJV - alway (-s), **ancient** (time), any more, continuance, eternal, (for, [n-]) ever (-lasting, -more, of old), lasting, long (time), (of) old (time), perpetual, at any time, (beginning of the) world (+without end). Compare OT:5331, OT:5703.

GLORY - OT:3519

OT:3519 dobK* kabowd (kaw-bode'); rarely kabod (kaw-bode'); from OT:3513; properly, **weight**, but only figuratively in a good sense, **splendor or copiousness: -glorious (-ly), glory, honour (-able)**.
