THIS WEEK'S LESSON: GRAND CANYON



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

When you stand on the edge of the canyon, you marvel at the thought of what it would take to get to the other side. When the Israelites reached the Red Sea, they saw no way across, but God showed them his amazing power to save. Exodus 14:5-29, The Rea Sea



M HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

AT DINNER:

AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:
