The Shepherd of My Soul — Week 3

Psalm 23:3b-4 (CSB)

"He leads me along the right paths for His name's sake. Even when I go through the darkest valley, I fear no danger, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff—they comfort me."

1. Living in the Shepherd's Presence

- **Meditation**: filling our minds with God's Word.
 - Repetition Questioning Listening
- John 14:26 The Holy Spirit will teach and remind you.
 John 6:45 "They will all be taught by God."
- Meditation is spiritual warfare—taking thoughts captive and replacing lies with truth.
 - 2 Corinthians 10:5; Isaiah 55:11
- Faith activates victory.

 John 6:29 "This is the work of God: that you believe in the One He has sent."

2. A Picture of Discipleship

- To **know** the Lord \rightarrow **trust** Him *I have all I need.*
- To trust Him → experience His benefits He renews my life.
- To experience His benefits \rightarrow live with purpose for His name's sake.

3. He Leads Me Along the Right Paths

- Paths (ma'gāl) a well-worn track: There is a way.
- **Righteousness** (*ședeq*) justice, rightness; reflecting God's character.
- The Shepherd leads us to right wrongs and mirror His heart in thought, word, and deed.

4. The Battle for the Mind

- Image of God (Gen 1) dependent reflection under His authority.
- "Be like God" (Gen 3) autonomy apart from His presence.
- Sin distorted our reflection; Jesus restores it through obedience and dependence.

5. Jesus: The Way and the Image

John 14:6 – "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life."

- Jesus is the image of the invisible God (Col 1:15).
- He did not grasp for equality but humbled Himself (Phil 2:6).
- Through His death and resurrection, **He made the path** we could not walk. Isaiah 43:19; Hebrews 2:10, 14

6. For His Name's Sake

- God reveals His Name—His nature and faithful love.
 - Exodus 3:14; 34:6-7
- The blessing places His Name on His people.
 - Numbers 6:24-27
- Jesus revealed and protected the Father's Name.
 - John 17:6-12, 22
- The Holy Spirit indwells us to make that Name known—forming Christ in us.
 - Romans 8:29

7. The Path Is Made

- Before the cross: "Where I am going, you cannot come." (John 13)
- After the resurrection: "Follow Me." (John 21:19)
- Jesus opened the way; the Spirit now empowers the walk. John 20:21-22; 2 Cor 5:17; Eph 2:10

8. Even in the Darkest Valley

- The Shepherd's **presence removes fear.**
 - "You are with me."
- His rod and staff protect and guide.
- Our comfort is not in circumstances but in companionship. Romans 8:28-30; Zechariah 4:6
