

**Introduction:** Bad days...we all have them! While bad days -- or bad seasons of life -- are inevitable, they don't have to paralyze us. People who want to experience successful and significant lives learn how to manage times of disappointment and discouragement, just as Elijah did.

### Two Portraits of Elijah

*1 Kings 18* "The hand of the Lord was on Elijah" (18:46). Elijah was full of faith. Elijah bravely confronts 850 false prophets. Elijah prayed for God to glorify Himself. Elijah became the leader of the people. *1 Kings 19* "He was afraid and ran for his life" (19:3). Elijah was full of fear. Elijah cowardly flees from one woman. Elijah prayed for God to take his life. Elijah abandoned the people.

- I. What Bad Days Look Like
  - A. **Discouragement** (1 Kings 19:4)

1 Kings 19:4 "But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree; and he requested for himself that he might die, and said, 'It is enough; now, O LORD, take my life, for I am not better than my fathers."

B. <u>Restlessness</u> (1 Kings 19:3)

1 Kings 19:3 "And he was afraid and arose and ran for his life and came to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there."



# C. <u>Foolishness</u> (1 Kings 19:4b)

1 Kings 19:4b "...and he requested for himself that he might die, and said, 'It is enough; now, O LORD, take my life, for I am not better than my fathers.'"

#### II. Warning Signs That Bad Days Are Coming

A. Being Physically and Emotionally Exhausted (John 10:10)

John 10:10 "The thief comes only to steal, and kill, and destroy; I [Jesus] came that they might have life, and might have it abundantly."

B. Focusing on Challenging <u>Circumstances</u> Rather than a Powerful God (1 Kings 19:1-2)

1 Kings 19:1 "Now Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword."

1 Kings 19:2 "Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, 'So may the gods do to me and even more, if I do not make your life as the life of one of them by tomorrow about this time."

1 Kings 19:3 "And he was afraid and arose and ran for his life and came to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there."

## D. Believing You are Indispensable (1 Kings 19:9-10, 18; Luke 19:40)

1 Kings 19:9 "Then he came there to a cave, and lodged there; and behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and He said to him, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?'"

1 Kings 19:10 "And he said, 'I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the sons of Israel have forsaken Thy covenant, torn down Thine altars and killed Thy prophets with the sword. And I alone am left; and they seek my life, to take it away."

1 Kings 19:18 "Yet I will leave 7,000 in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal and every mouth that has not kissed him."

Luke 19:40 "And He [Jesus] answered [the Pharisees] and said, 'I tell you, if these [His disciples] become silent, the stones will cry out!"
