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REFLECT THIS WEEK

Ezekiel's tour found idolatry hidden inside the temple, in a room no one else could see. What is in your hidden room right now? What do you actually run to when life gets hard?

The leaders said, "The LORD does not see us" (8:12). Where do you live as if God isn't paying attention? What would change today if you truly believed He sees?

The people God marked were the ones who "sigh and groan" over sin (9:4). Has sin, your own or the world's, stopped grieving you? What has gone numb that used to bother you?

The men in chapter 11 trusted the city to keep them safe. What are you tempted to trust instead of God's actual presence: a church background, a good reputation, a comfortable life?

God promised to replace a heart of stone with a heart of flesh (11:19), something we cannot do for ourselves. Where are you "trying harder" when what you really need is a new heart? Have you asked Him for one?

Jesus cried "Why have you forsaken me?" so that God's presence would never leave His people. How does it change this week to know God came back for you, and paid that much to do it?

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
